### Why is another project necessary now?

☛ Simply put, the timing and circumstances are right. Although the district made many much-needed improvements through recent projects, other priorities identified in our facilities plan had to be deferred because of cost constraints. We now have an opportunity to complete that work at no cost to local taxpayers.

☛ State building aid and Qualified School Construction Bonds – earmarked for school renovations only – will pay for the project with no local tax increase.

***\$18.9 million project: No local property tax impact***

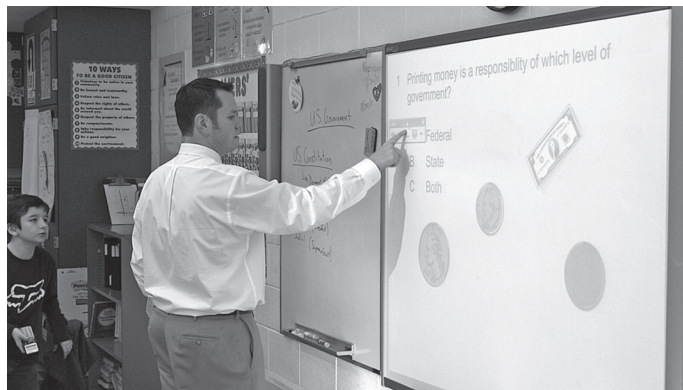
### What is included in the proposed project?

Proposed facilities improvements include:

☛ **WES:** New windows, roof and skylight replacement, interactive whiteboards and projectors in classrooms, new digital sign

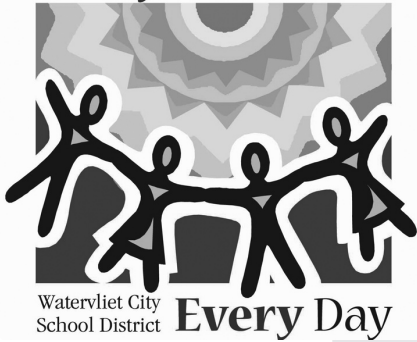
☛ **WJSHS:** Science classrooms and other learning space renovations, window replacement, auditorium upgrades, artificial turf field with 6-lane running track (8-lane straight), new concession stand and field lighting

You are eligible to vote if you are a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, and a resident of the school district for at least 30 days prior to the vote.

You also must be a registered voter to vote.
