


Budget Workshops #1 & 2 Recap

- Projected Fund Balance for SYE 6/30/23: \$5.55M (\$2.57M Unreserved/\$2.98M Reserves)
- Executive Budget Proposal includes an increase of \$4.4M in Foundation Aid
 - Foundation aid includes a \$461k high impact tutoring set aside
- Maximum Tax Levy for 2023-24: \$7.7M
 - Year over year increase of 2.15%
- SY 2023-24 Budget Development
 - Identifying student needs in academic areas & growing subgroups
 - Adopting regional approaches to shared services
 - Aligning budget with remaining Federal ARPA funding
 - Long-term plan for financing "Debt Bubble"

SY 2023-24 Tax Levy

- "Debt Bubble": Beginning in the 2023-24 SY, estimated debt service will be greater than Building Aid
 - Net Expenditures are estimated to be \$1.1M over revenues beginning in 2025-26 SY
- <u>Maximum</u> Tax Cap Limit for 2023-24: \$7,701, 408
 - 2.15% increase of \$162,256 over 2022-23 SY
- Anticipated Tax Levy for 2023-24: \$7,586,000
 - 2.12% increase of \$157,990 over 2022-23 SY

 - Replace 2 retiring teachers (\$30,000) Watervliet Jr/Sr High School +\$ 85,000 1.0 FTE Special Education teacher **Restore 1.0 FTE science teacher** +\$ 85,000 **Replace 3 retiring teachers** (\$40,000) Alternative Learning Pathway (1.0 FTE Teacher & 1.0 FTA TA) +\$ 135.000 **District-wide** Increase of 24 minutes of instructional time +\$ 626,000 Shared 1.0 FTE ENL Teacher +\$ 85,000 **Provide mental health support with contracted services** +\$ 50,000

2023-24 Budget Considerations

- Cost to maintain current programs and personnel
- Building Aid reduction of \$710,000
- Debt Service > Building Aid
- Federal ESSER/GEER/ARPA Grants: September 2023 & 2024
- One-House Legislative Budget Bills introduced earlier this week
 - High-impact tutoring, UPK allocations
- Health Insurance Premiums estimated to increase by 12%
